 - South Putt Corners Road Safety Initiative

8.1 Request for Approval of South Putt Corners Road Safety Initiative

Recommendation - that the New Paltz Central Schools Board of Education approve the following:

WHEREAS, in accordance with a letter from Thomas H. Jackson, Jr., Ulster County Commissioner of Public Works, dated March 20, 2018, the Ulster County Department of Public Works (UCDPW), as part of County Executive Hein's commitment to traffic safety in Ulster County, is seeking to study the possibility of establishing a regulated School Zone on South Putt Corners Road near New Paltz High School, which would, among other things, reduce the speed limit in the area around the entrance to the High School; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education believes that the safety of students, staff and visitors at New Paltz High School, as well as the general public, is of paramount importance;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education expresses its strong support of the UCDPW initiative to study and establish a regulated School Zone on South Putt Corners Road and concomitant speed reduction in the areas near the entrance to the High School and authorizes the Board President to execute and issue a letter in support of this initiative to be sent to Town of New Paltz Supervisor Bettez and copied to Commissioner Jackson.

8.2 Resolution on High Stakes Testing

WHEREAS, our nation's and New York State's future well-being relies on a high-quality public education system that prepares all students for college, careers, citizenship, and lifelong learning, and strengthens the nation's social and economic well-being; and

WHEREAS, our nation's school systems have been spending growing amounts of time, money and energy on high-stakes standardized testing, in which student performance on standardized tests is used to make major decisions affecting individual students, educators, and schools; and

WHEREAS, the overreliance on high-stakes standardized testing in state and federal accountability systems is undermining educational quality and equity in U.S. public schools by hampering educators' efforts to focus on the broad range of learning experiences that promote the innovation, creativity, problem solving, collaboration, communication, critical thinking and deep subject-matter knowledge that will allow students to thrive in a democracy and an increasingly global society and economy; and

WHEREAS, it is widely recognized that standardized testing is an inadequate and often unreliable measure of both student learning and educator effectiveness; and

WHEREAS, the over-emphasis on standardized testing has caused considerable collateral damage in too many schools, including narrowing the curriculum, teaching to the test, reducing love of learning, pushing students out of school, driving excellent teachers out of the profession, and undermining school climate; and

WHEREAS, high-stakes standardized testing has negative effects for students from all backgrounds, and especially for low-income students, English language learners, children of color, and those with disabilities; and

WHEREAS, we do not oppose accountability in public schools and point with pride to the stellar performance of our students and teachers, but believe that standardized tests dominate instructional time and block our ability to make progress toward a world-class education system of student-centered schools and future-ready students;

THERFORE BE IT RESOLVED that New Paltz Central School District calls on Governor Cuomo, Commissioner Elia, the State Legislature, and the Board of Regents to reexamine public school accountability systems in this state, including the Annual Professional Performance Review (APPR) and to develop a system based on multiple forms of assessment which does not require extensive standardized testing, more accurately reflects the broad range of student learning, and is used to support students and improve schools.
