- 6) What do you consider to be your greatest strengths? What classes here at NPHS did you particularly excel in? What makes you unique, in your opinion? Tell me any other positive attributes about yourself that I can include in my letter (even though I'm sure I already have many positive things to say about you!) What are you most proud of from my course?
