Plan - Start a 1:1 Device Program for Students Grades 3-12

Starting with 3rd and 8th grade students, each student and their teachers will receive a Chromebook from the district (on a five year replacement cycle) to be used to address the following goals:

- Increase student learning and support differentiated instruction. Help teachers deliver more personalized lessons to students, while allowing them to learn at their own pace and ability level.
- Ensure equal access and learning opportunities for all students. Expand learning beyond the classroom.

- Improve communication and collaboration among students, teachers, and parents.
- Help our students understand the importance of internet safety, digital citizenship, and developing a positive digital footprint.
- Provide more enrichment opportunities for students and help them develop essential problem solving and critical thinking skills.



What is a Chromebook?

- 10 hour battery life
- Boots in under 10 seconds runs on Chrome OS
- Touch screen
- Dual cameras and built in microphone to expand learning and creative opportunities for students.
- Built in virus protection
- Software
- Automatic updates (for this device up until June 2025)

No initial fees or repair charges within the 1:1 program.



Filtering

CIPA requires that schools use "a technology protection measure with respect to any of its computers with internet access that protects against access through such computers to visual depictions that are obscene, child pornography, or harmful to minors." The law also requires that schools monitor the activity of minors online to detect potential inappropriate use.


