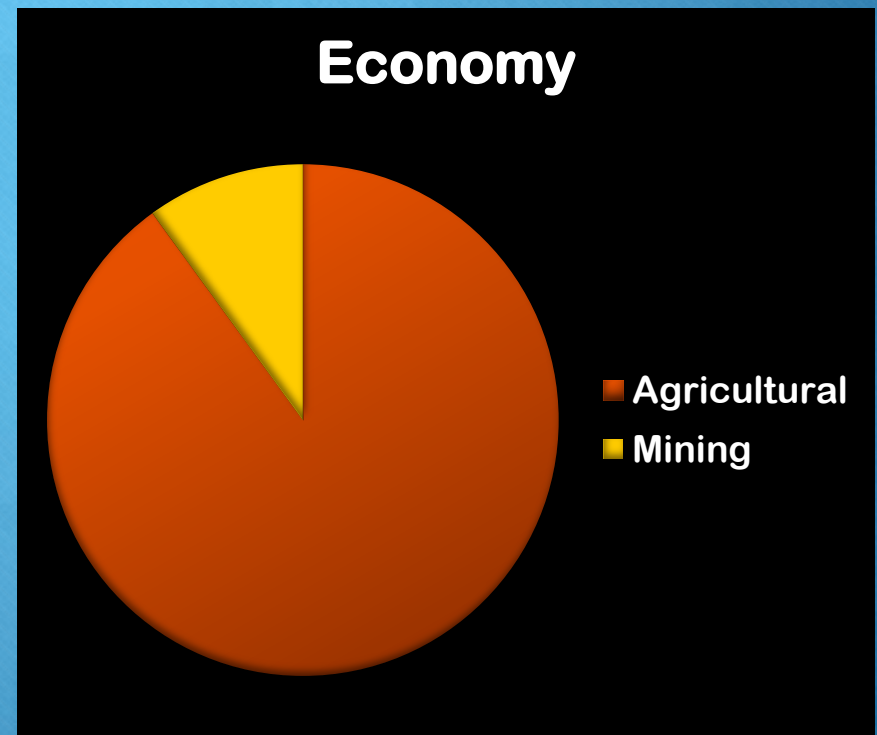


- Region: Southern Africa
 - West of Lake Malawi
 - Mostly plateau
- Climate Zone: Sub-Tropical
 - Rainy Season (Nov. – May)
 - Dry Seasons (May – Nov.)
- Natural Resources:
 - Fertile Soil which allows people to grow: tobacco, sugarcane, cotton, tea, corn, potatoes, cassava, sorghum, groundnuts, Macadamia nuts, cattle, goats
 - Mining uranium, coal, and bauxite (aluminum ore)
