Waldorf vs. NPMS

There are two middle schools in New Paltz, Mountain Laurel Waldorf School (MLWS), and New Paltz Middle School (NPMS). I'm sure some people have been to both, but for the people who haven't, this is my comparison of the two.

Let me start off by saying these are two very different environments, almost like a simple machine vs. an industrial one. Waldorf's focus is creating a loving and peaceful environment for its students all the way from preschool to 8th grade, while the public

school system has a more professional approach, pumping out educated children ready to learn for high school. I love my teachers at NPMS, but I only see them for 40 minutes per day. At MLWS, children there have one teacher throughout our entire education, giving MLWS a more personal vibe.

Another difference between these two schools is the everyday schedule. I would assume elementary school is the same, but once it gets to middle school they branch out. In public school, the children are introduced to a high school schedule. Multiple periods in a day, and the children are more independent, with different teachers, not just one. In MLWS, the kids stay with their teacher all day.

The most shocking difference between MLWS and NPMS is the way we are taught. In MLWS, the kids learn in blocks throughout the year. Two hours a day they learn what's in their main block, mostly something unique students at NPMS don't learn. For example, MLWS students might learn about ancient Rome, Greek mythology, astrology, ect. We would have to copy from a writing about the topic or make our own essay. The MLWS focus is more on art and writing more than anything. I remember in the MLWS education, the only math we learned was through a booklet that we had to complete for homework. We didn't have many math lessons. I remember learning geometry but not much other than that. The MLWS education didn't line up much with the curriculum of 5th and 6th grade. Another fact that I think is enlightening is that in the MLWS education, we spent 2 hours a day on knitting/sewing or sculpting work. That is 2 hours wasted that we could have been learning about science or math, something that was lacking in Waldorf education.

In our industrial machine, NPMS, the teachers focus on teaching the curriculum so that the children are prepared for the next grade, or high school. They are judged, paid, and educated based on the grades their students get. They can't personalize the curriculum like Waldorf educators can.

In conclusion, I believe that while public education is more efficient, it could be helped to make it more personal. Incorporating Waldorf beliefs into public education could make a bigger impact on children's happiness, as well as adding more mind stimulation to the curriculum. Although we spent 2 hours a day knitting or sculpting in the MLWS school, it enriched our brains and gave us a break from learning. I believe that if we even added some type of activity with our hands in the public school day, it would be beneficial to our ability to learn.

The Fall of Silicon Valley Bank

How did the 16th largest bank in the US go out of business in a matter of days? Does it ever recover? How will this affect investors and the economy? These were all questions everyone had when Silicon Valley Bank failed, including myself. In this article I hope to answer these questions and shed light on the sudden failure of Silicon Valley Bank.

Why the Bank Failed

Silicon Valley Bank (SVB) started to decline once investments started to lose value. This was due to high inflation in the economy, so SVB responded by increasing their interest rates on their bonds. Because of this decision investors began to withdraw money causing a run on the bank.

SVB contained roughly \$120 billion, which under the Dodd-Frank Act (an act created to prevent runs on banks with over \$50 billion in assets after the financial failure of 2008) would have required them to follow more significant guidelines. But they were exempt from these regulations as of 2018 when President Donald Trump signed a law increasing the asset requirement from \$50 billion to \$250 billion. This put SVB much below the minimum amount, thus causing them to not be held to higher standards, ultimately leading to the second largest financial fail in history.

The Bank Fail

As of March 10th, 2023 the SVB was officially taken over by Federal Regulators. After the regulators failed to find a buyer for the bank, they moved all deposits and assets to Bridge Bank. Seven days later SVB's parent company, SVB Financial Group, filed bankruptcy. And 16 days after the collapse First Citizens Bank acquired all assets except for \$90 billion of securities.

The Aftermath

The FDIC helped insure up to \$250,000 of each deposit. Essentially, people who deposited \$250,000 or below would receive all their money back. The unfortunate part about this was many held more than just \$250,000 in the bank. So many people didn't receive most of their money.

Now investments were much more tricky to deal with than deposits. Investments were unsecured and there was no real guarantee that investors would receive any of their money back.

Currently most assets are either held in First Citizens Bank or Bridge Bank. And as for Silicon Valley Bank, it does not exist anymore except as the ongoing reminder of the government overlooking many banks across America.


Sogo Osaka:

My thoughts on the anime club:



Summary of this article:
























Artemis Flight Mission
