What you need to know about Covid-19:

1: Coronavirus is like the flu, but has a little more of a kick into it.

2: People at risk are the elderly and people with certain pre-existing medical conditions. Some of the medical conditions are asthma, diabetes, and heart disease.

3: So far, a vaccine is being tested on people who are volunteers. 170,000 doses will be shipped to New York by December 15.

4. Some of the symptoms to Covid are fever or chills, fatigue, shortness of breath, head or muscle aches, loss of taste or smell, runny nose, cough, and sore throat.

Ways to stay safe during covid:

Some ways to stay safe during this time period is to wear a mask when you're going somewhere besides your home, and make sure to wash your hands frequently throughout the day. If you have any of the symptoms for Covid, make sure to take a test and to quarantine at home.

Total case count: New York in general has had 712,984 cases total.

Neighboring towns of New Paltz: Orange county(1,792 cases), Greene county(117 cases), Sullivan county(217 cases), and Dutchess county(1,046 cases).

Ulster County: Ulster County has at least 3,500 cases

New Paltz: New Paltz currently has 86 cases.

If you haven't, now you have! These animals are Pterosaurs. Pterosaurs are <u>not</u> dinosaurs. As a matter of fact, neither Pteranodon, Dimorphodon, nor Quetzalcoatlus are examples of dinosaurs. Here's why: Pterosaurs are not dinosaurs because they flew and their front limbs stretched out from the side of their torso. Although they are distant cousins, they aren't dinosaurs.

Mosasauridae and Elasmosauriae

To make:

Crush Oreos in a food processor until fine. Measure out 1 1/2 cups of it and put in a medium size bowl. Add the butter to the crushed Oreos and mix with your hands. Press into the bottom and sides of a 9-inch round glass dish. Freeze for 10 minutes. Once the 10 minutes is up, put approximately 3 1/2 cups of softened vanilla ice cream in it. Freeze then slice into pie shapes. Store in the freezer.

This Month on Game Review: Animal Crossing New Horizons

Introduction

Animal Crossing New Horizons is one of the newest games to come to switch, and quite a popular one too. The animal crossing series has always been a popular one, but this one has by far has the best graphics, smoothest gameplay and coolest features. In New Horizons you start off by getting invited on an island getaway. You then fly to a deserted island with little to no resources and what somewhat represents a town hall. You slowly progress throughout the game by earning bells, which are the main currency in the game, and making your island a better place.

Town Hall

In most Animal crossing games there's some building in the center of your island that represents a town hall. For New Horizons this is where Tom Nook and his nephews Timmy and Tommy work on helping you improve your island. Every morning Tom Nook gives you your daily news such as an event coming up soon. Over time your town hall will upgrade from a small tent into a large building. Once the town hall upgrades, Isabell to your island. She is a former deserted island buyer. In the mornings instead of Tom Nook, Isabell now tells you the news for the day. But unlike Tom Nook she can sometimes give you useless news like her old sock has been found, and she enjoyed watching a tv show even though there's no tv in town hall and it's open 24/7 and she's in there the whole time.

Museum

In every Animal Crossing game there's a museum. The way you get it in new horizons is by talking to Tom Nook, you can give him 5 bugs, fish or sea creatures and in return he'll call his friend Blathers. You can then set up Blathers tent on your island, and if you give him bugs, fish or sea creatures he will then give you 2 crafting recipes for the vaulting pole and the shovel. The vaulting pole helps you explore your island by letting you hop across the water and the shovel lets you dig up fossils which are marked with a star on the ground which you can give to Blathers and or sell for a good price. The other

thing he asks is to build a museum on your island! In said museum all of the Art, Bugs, Fish, Fossils, and Sea creatures you've collected and given to Blathers are displayed in sections each one has its own section except for sea creatures [displayed with fish].

Crafting

Crafting is a big part of New Horizons. This is a new idea to the series, which Nintendo felt suited the idea of a deserted island life. This game allows you to craft tools, items, decorations, and many other things. You can use materials such as wood, stone, clay, iron, and gold that you can gather from your island. In order to craft something, you need a DIY recipe. You can get these as gifts, from your villagers, in floating presents, and you can even find them in message bottles that washed up on shore! You can also customize most crafted items, to make them different patterns or colors. There are also seasonal crafting recipes, which mean that the materials and the recipes themselves can only be obtained during certain months. In Autumn, there are pumpkins, mushrooms, pine cones and acorns. In spring there's young spring bamboo. In summer it's summer shells. And in winter there's snowflakes. To increase your island rating, you need a certain number of crafted items.

Island Ratings

As your island gets better and better it's rating will go up. This rating is out of five possible stars, and you can get it by talking to Isabell at the town hall. You can up this island rating by planting flowers and trees, as well as placing various items throughout your island. You can also use things like different types of fencing. Isabell will give you tips on what you need to get your rating to five stars. There are many ways you can get items, including: crafting (see above), buying them, and getting them as gifts. Flowers and trees will appear naturally on your island, but you can also buy them at Nook's Cranny.

Villagers

In Animal Crossing there are animals that live on your island but they act like humans. There are over 300 villagers. Tom Nook and the Nook twins, for example, are all tanooky, which is a made up animal from japanese mythology. The tanooky is the trickster in japanese mythology, but back on topic Isabelle is a dog, and the people who run the airport are dodo's. But in the game you can get many different types of villagers on your island. By types I mean personality types, there's Snooty, Lazy, Grumpy, Peppy, Normal, Jock, Sisterly, and Smug. Each villager with a different personality has different things they say. You can become friends with the villagers by giving them gifts and talking to them regularly. The maximum number of villagers you can have on your island at a time is ten. Villagers have their own birthday in game. On their birthday you can attend their party and give them gifts.

Nook's Cranny

After a while, the Nook twins will want to start their own shop. I'm order for this to happen you will have to give them 90 wood and 30 iron nuggets. At this shop, you can buy 2 large and 2 small items. These items can be placed inside your house or on your island, and will help your island ratings [Seen above] go up. After spending 200,000 bells and having it on your island for 30 days, the shop will get an upgrade. This includes a new exterior and a new large item for sale every day for a total of 3 instead of 2. The shop has seasonal items available as well. Another feature of this shop is that you can sell your unwanted items to Timmy and Tommy. There's also an additional cabinet in the store where you can buy a multitude of different items, such as crafting recipes, tools, flower starts, wallpapers, and flooring. Nook's Cranny is 1 of 2 shops on your island, but without it you wouldn't be able to do many things in game.

Able Sisters

The Able Sisters is the other shop on your island. It is a shop that was opened by a family of three sisters that are pretty well known in the series, named Sable, Mabel and Lable. The shop starts out as Mabel setting up a small tent on your island. You can buy a couple items of clothing, but not that many. She eventually asks if she can start a shop on your island, and she does. One of the sisters (Lable), however, is not usually in the shop. Instead, she will occasionally stop by your island and ask you to model clothes for her, and she will reward you with coupons for the store if you do. On the topic of the store itself, you can buy things like clothes for your character there. The shop sells seasonal items and will change it's displays daily. A feature you will get pretty early on in the game is the ability to create custom designs. You can design your own clothing! You can even post them online or display them in your shop for others to see. There is also a changing room so that you can try on the clothes and see what they would look like before you have to buy them. The clothes can be somewhat pricey depending on what you buy. But with the coupons you can get from Lable, you get the items for free.

Jolly Redd's Treasure Trawler

Jolly Redd is a fox that you're warned about in game. Redd is Tom Nook's nemesis, he and Tom Nook used to work together and it seems Tom Nook got the short end of the stick. The first time you see Redd he's walking about your island, he then says you're his closest friend and you are practically cousins. He sells you art which you give to Blathers the museum curator [Seen above] and he makes an art section of your museum. After that Redd shows up on your island in a boat. Its name is " Jolly Redd's Treasure trawler." Redd will then give you multiple pieces of art to choose from at a cousins discount, some is real and some is fake. If it's a fake piece of art and you give it to Blathers he yells at you and returns it. Redd only shows up 1-2 times every 2 weeks, so finishing the art section of your museum is a challenge. In the end you have to be cautious when shopping from Redd but at the same time always try to buy something, because you can only buy 1 work of art while Redds on your island.

Leif and Kicks

Leif and Kicks, like Lable, show up in the center of your town hall once every 2 weeks. Leif sells only plants that you can't get anywhere else, and will buy your weeds that you can pick up off the grass for instead of their normal price, 10 bells at Nook's Cranny, he buys them for 20. The creators think Leif should have his own shop on your island but that won't happen for a while now. The other person who shows up is Kicks! Kicks is a laid back skunk that sells backpacks and shoes for a good price. Kicks like Leif does deserve his very own shop.

Saharah and Daisy Mae

Saharan and Daisy Mae are also characters that will visit your island once in a while, but they are different. They will walk around your island and can be found anywhere on it. Saharah is a camel that will sell you wallpaper, flooring, and rugs. Rugs come in different sizes, and by purchasing one, he will give you a coupon. This can be used when buying stuff from him, and enough of them will get you a random free rug. Daisy Mae will walk around with turnips for sale. She comes every Sunday. These can be sold at Nook's Cranny, creating a stock market element. The price will change twice a day and the goal is to buy them for less than you sell them for.

Flick and CJ: Bugs, Fish, and Sea creatures In Animal Crossing New Horizons there are two figures that visit your island. Their names are Flick and CJ, Flick is obsessed with bugs and can make bug statues, and CJ is obsessed with fish and sea creatures and can make statues of either or. Each statute requires 3 of the animals you want, then you hand it over and the next day a statue will be delivered to you. They also pay you more bells for fish bugs and sea creatures. In game you can craft a fishing rod/ bug net to catch fish or bugs. Bugs will run away if you're too slow or if there's a beat box or radio in the general proximity, and they will spawn on flowers, rocks, beach rocks, all types of trees in the water and butterflies and dragonflies spawn in the air. Fish have different sizes, each fish is a black shadow in the water so you can't tell what you will catch. You have to cast your rod in front of its face to get its attention, once you've gotten its attention you then wait till the bobber goes under press A and it auto reels it in. Each shadow size has its own different types of fish. For sea creatures you need a wetsuit, once you get one you can jump into the water and go diving. Like fish the sea creatures are shadows in the water that have bubbles. Once you go under by pressing Y you can then swim onto the shadow and pull up your creature. But keep in mind you might not want to sell these animals because blathers will happily take them off your hands.

K.K. Slider

K.K. Slider is a popular CPU in the Animal Crossing universe. He's a very popular music artist. The first main goal of the game is to have a three star island. When you achieve that, he will come and perform his songs at your island. After the first performance, he will come every Saturday. When he comes, he will give you a couple options. He will take requests of songs that you want him to perform, or he will play one based on what mood you're in. You can also buy CD's at the town hall in the ATM machine for 2,000 bells.

Travel and Nook miles

Animal Crossing is pretty well known for being a multiplayer family game. In the game, you can travel to other players' islands as long as you have friended them. On other players' islands, you can do basically everything you can do on your own. You can collect materials, visit villagers, and much more. There is another traveling component in this game. This is Nook Miles Tickets. These can be purchased at the town hall for 2,000 Nook Miles a piece. These tickets allow you to travel to a randomly generated mystery island. This small island will have trees, flowers, rocks, and other common resources. These can be collected and taken back to your island to keep and use. These randomly generated islands can have a random villager if you have a plot open. You can not access this island after you leave it, so make sure you don't forget anything there! All you have to do to do traveling of any kind is visit the airport on the south end of your island. Here, you can travel to other islands as we mentioned, or invite your friends over to your island.

Flowers

Flowers are a big part of upping your island rating. You can buy flowers every day at Nook's Cranny, and from Leif. Without flowers you can't get a 5 star island. You can breed different flowers to get new colors and types of flowers. The rarest breedable flower is the blue rose, it took us over 5 months of trial and error to get one. You can also pick flowers and place the picked flower in a pot or wear it in your hair and for roses in your mouth. Each island has its own set of naturally grown flowers on it and when you go to different islands there's a chance you can get other types of flowers.

Among Us
