We hope this email finds you well. As we finish off the school year, we wanted to send a few updates on end-of-year matters:

- Report cards will be mailed out to families during the second week of July. One change you will
 notice is that students will receive a "NA" for all 3rd trimester standards. The reason for this is
 that, given the circumstances, our teachers may not be able to accurately assess your child's
 progress in these learning areas.

- The Duzine-Lenape PTA will be distributing yearbooks to Duzine families this Thursday, June 25th from 9:30am-11:00am and 5:00pm-6:30pm as well as on Friday, June 26th from 12:00pm-1:00pm. The distribution will take place in the Duzine parking lot.

- Teacher websites will remain accessible to parents over the summer. In addition, our reading teachers have put together a collection of suggested resources. You will find their message included as a separate attachment.

- As the district is in the planning stages of reopening, the amount of information we currently have regarding what school will look like in September is very limited. With that being said, you can anticipate receiving your child's class placement letter in August. As soon as more information becomes available regarding reopening we will share it with families.
