On Saturday, February 23rd, New Paltz High School Band students traveled to Skidmore College in Saratoga Springs, New York to participate in the Skidmore Wind and Brass Festival.

Students took on challenging performance tasks in small, student-led chamber groups. Participating students received chamber music coachings from Skidmore Faculty, joined college students in the Festival Concert Band, and performed in the acoustically-tuned Helen Filene Ladd Concert Hall at Arthur Zankel Music Center. Additionally, individual students qualified for master classes with professional musicians on the Skidmore faculty.

The Grand Finale featured New Paltz High School students and director Sam Newsome joining the Festival Concert Band in performing with the Windscape Quintet, an elite New York City-based professional woodwind quintet.
