New Paltz Student Takes 1st in Photo Contest

- artwork in the categories of painting, drawing/mixed media and photography. Elizabeth Sheehy, a New
- Paltz High School student, was the only teenager to submit amongst all other adult submissions and was awarded a first place ribbon and a Certificate of Achievement by the Historic Preservation Commission

in the photography category.

Alternative Lunch Space

- Beginning May 1st, an alternative lunch space opened up on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays.
- C.A.F.E. (cafeteria alternative for everyone) is held in what was the Guidance Office. The space has been

On Wednesday, May 23rd, Computer Science teacher Joe Haas brought a group of 19 AP Computer Science students to the first annual New Paltz High School Engineering Shadow Day at IBM Poughkeepsie. The host for the day was IBM engineer Kennedy Cheruiyot.

Students were divide into groups of two or three and had the opportunity to shadow two software engineers during the day. In this small group setting, students were encouraged to ask questions and have • an open dialog with the programmers, enabling students to have an authentic experience of the job of a system programmer. Some of our students exchanged contact information with the engineers to allow them to continue the dialog in the future.

In the afternoon, students toured the IBM Z series mainframes test floor. In this absolutely massive area, the machines are kept running 24-7 and closely monitored while they are subjected to a variety of extreme conditions. Our students were definitely impressed by the scale of the site. We hope to continue

• the relationship with IBM for many years to come.
