Vaping

Not only is JUUL making smoking seem cool again, many kids seem to have the <u>erroneous impression</u> that, unlike cigarettes, JUUL is safe to use. In reality it delivers enough nicotine to be enormously addictive, especially for teenagers, who brains are still developing, making them more easily addicted than adults!

Scott Gottlieb, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) Commissioner has declared youth vaping an "epidemic…Teenagers are becoming regular users and the proportion of regular users is increasing." We are going to have to take action. "No one can look at the data and say there is no problem."

The Choral concert is at 2:30 p.m. and the Instrumental concert is at 4:30 p.m.
