Office 365 Accounts

In September, we began introducing our students to their new Office 365 accounts. This account includes their student email, One Drive (online, cloud based file storage), and online versions of Word, Excel, PowerPoint, and OneNote. Student accounts also give them the ability to download (for free) the full Office Suite (Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Outlook, and OneNote) on up to FIVE personal devices (PC, Mac, tablet, smartphone, etc.) There has been a lot of positive feedback and we look forward to exploring the many features of Office 365. The competition, presented in partnership with the New York State Teachers and Writers Collaborative, the National Endowment for the Arts, and the Poetry Foundation, is part of a national program that encourages high school students to learn about great poetry through memorization, performance and competition. Over the past 10 years, Poetry Out Loud has reached nearly 3 million students, more than 9,500 schools, and thousands of teachers across the country.
