
### teen Mental Health First Aid

Next week we will kick -off our partnership with The Maya Golf Foundation during Study Halls (2A, 2B, 4A, and 4B). Teen Mental Health First Aid, or tMHFA, is an evidence-based training program for students in grades 10–12 that teaches the skills to recognize and aid their peers experiencing mental health and substance abuse challenges and crises, including how to quickly get the help of an adult. The tMHFA program is designed to help teens help each other navigate the difficult waters of adolescence. The program is offered by Maya Gold Foundation trainers certified by the National Council for Mental Well Being. We will begin training some students in study hall and have plans to expand this offering to other students in the near future.
