
Congratulations and Great Job to John

## HISPANIC YOUTH LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE

Three of our students, Emily Inga (Senior), Ana Porrua (Junior) and Yobana Mercado-Nuñez (Junior) were selected to represent New Paltz at this year's Puerto Rican/Hispanic Youth Leadership Institute. Emily, Ana, and Yobana have participated in two training sessions so far and will continue with ten more sessions until March. The overall purpose of the PR/HYLI is student empowerment. To this end the institute has the following goals for its student delegates: the development of leadership skills in Hispanic Youth, the creation of opportunities for Hispanic students to interact with positive role models such as Puerto Rican/Hispanic elected officials, educators, and business leaders, the creation of partnerships and the development of an in-depth knowledge of the state legislative process. These three students will train in the Mid-Hudson delegation and study the NYS legislative process and parliamentary procedures. This four month training will culminate with a 3-day institute where approximately 200 students from 8 delegations statewide take part in key activities which include team-building exercises to develop interregional relationships, a Mock Assembly session which is conducted in the NYS Assembly chamber, a student recognition dinner where winners of the PR/HYLI scholarships and other awards are announced and career development workshops. - Mr. Castro
